The club will be responsible for the Red Cross Blood Drive sometime in July.

The club will also be handling the July 4th parking for the Town of New Market, which is a good fund raiser for our projects.

Discussion was held on the request from District to consider sponsoring the formation of an Interact Club (up to the age of 18). It was agreed to arrange a meeting with the District representative to find out more about what is required.
